GRANTS



Rong Chen, PhD received a two-year, \$439,061 R21 grant from the National Institute on Aging to study “Understanding Dynamics of Brain Network in TDP-43 Related Neurodegeneration.” Dr. Chen also was awarded \$385,612 as a multi-PI on a twenty-two month R21 grant from the NIA studying “Integrating Experimental and Computational Models to Study the Prefrontal Microcircuit Changes During Aging and Alzheimer’s Disease.”



Sui-Seng Tee, PhD received two supplements to his R21 grants from the National Institute on Aging: a \$388,714 administrative supplement to his study, “Longitudinal Metabolic Imaging of the Brain in Synucleinopathy,” and a \$165,763 diversity supplement to his grant studying “Longitudinal Imaging of Maternal Exercise and Exerkine Effects on Offspring Metabolism.”



Thomas Ernst, PhD received a two-year \$382,388 R21 grant from the National

Institute of Biomedical Imaging and Bioengineering to study “Elimination of Slice Alignment Errors in 2-dimensional Structural MRI.”



David Dreizin, MD received a \$230,176 supplement to his NIH R01 “Human-centered CT-based CAD Tools for Traumatic Torso Hemorrhage.” This allows for the purchase of a multi-GPU server, expected to greatly accelerate experimentation, training, and inference in the [Trauma Radiology Artificial Intelligence Laboratory \(TRAIL\)](#).
