## INSTRUCTIONS FOR STORAGE AND RE-USE OF N95 RESPIRATORS

The following instructions are adapted from the UMMC Unified PPE Guidance protocol.

## STORAGE OF PREVIOUSLY WORN DISPOSABLE N95 RESPIRATORS

- After removing your N95 respirator, visually inspect for contamination and distortion in shape/form. If the respirator is contaminated/wet, creased, or bent, the N95 should be discarded.
- 2. If the N95 respirator **is NOT visibly contaminated or distorted**, carefully store to avoid destroying the shape and consistency of the respirator.
- 3. The N95 respirator should be stored in a well-ventilated container (i.e., paper bag) with username & date written on the container.
- 4. Recommend writing username on an elastic strap, also.
- 5. A disposable N95 respirator can be worn for several hours and multiple shifts if not wet or distorted, not touched while delivering patient care, and not involved in an aerosol-generating procedure (CDC and NIOSH, pandemic response).

**PROCESS TO REUSE DISPOSABLE N95 RESPIRATORS**: Remove N95 respirator from storage bag and visually inspect for distortion. *If creased or bent do not re-use*.

## Donning:

- 1. Perform hand hygiene.
- 2. Don gown and gloves.
- 3. Don the N-95 respirator.
- 4. **Ensure a tight seal** if not a tight seal, the respirator cannot be re-used.
  - Perform a negative/positive fit check by doing the following:
  - No air should be felt around the perimeter while blowing out. If you feel air coming out
    it is not a tight seal.
  - When taking a small breath in, the respirator should pucker in slightly. If it does not, it is not re-usable.
- 5. Ensure the respirator is breathable. **If you are unable to breathe in the respirator**, the respirator cannot be re-used.
- 6. Don respirator with full faceshield or goggles over N95.
