HONORING A LEGACY

The University of Maryland School of Medicine is pleased to honor **Dr. Walter Weintraub** for his dedication as a passionate educator, leader and collaborator through the establishment of the 60th Anniversary Endowment for Education in Psychiatry in his honor. This endowment will provide educational resources to inspire students and trainees, expand the frontiers of knowledge, and further our position as continued pioneers in the psychiatric community.

Dr. Weintraub dedicated his career to improving the field of Psychiatry, especially in the State of Maryland. He made a lasting impact in many ways, including two programs he established and devoted much energy: The Combined Accelerated Program in Psychiatry (CAPP) and the Maryland Plan.

In 1957 Dr. Weintraub, then 32 years old, moved to Baltimore to join the University of Maryland School of Medicine faculty as a research associate. Two years later he took charge of the adult inpatient psychiatric service in the Psychiatric Institute, an important training site for psychiatry residents and medical students.

In 1970, Dr. Weintraub was appointed Director of Training, a position he was delighted to receive and which he held for twenty years. Dr. Weinbraub set out to establish new teaching models, including an accelerated psychiatry track to provide a select group of general medical students with an enriched study of human behavior, focused on the doctor/patient relationship.

The program elevated the standing of the Department of Psychiatry at the University of Maryland School of Medicine, and its positive effects were far reaching – all the way to the state capital. Dr. Weintraub recalled that "[CAPP] was getting more teaching done than any other kind of program and the legislators [in Annapolis] were impressed." CAPP students were more likely to choose psychiatry as a specialty than other students. Since its inception, the CAPP has seen the participation of more than 400 students and is still going strong today.

In 1978 Dr. Weintraub launched the Maryland Plan, an innovative collaboration between the state and University of Maryland School of Medicine's Department of Psychiatry to train, and recruit more psychiatrists to work in the public sector. This collaboration also continues to this day, providing innovative programs and opportunities to meet the needs of many of our most troubled patients.
