*\* This training also uses the term "people" to include women, nonbinary, transgender or non-conforming individuals experiencing pregnancy or in a parenting role.*

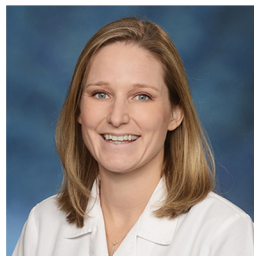
