Rank Order Lists

Creating Your Rank Order Lists – Tips and Reminders

ROL must be **CERTIFIED** by 3/4/26 at 9 PM – we **highly recommend certifying no later than Mon 3/2** to avoid local server traffic issues in the final days.

- Understand the [Match process](#) and how the algorithm works for you!
- Rank programs in your true order of preference
- Rank all programs where you interviewed (unless you would rather go unmatched than be a particular program)
- Do NOT rank programs where you did not interview
- Confirm that your NRMP ID is linked to ERAS or ResidencyCAS
- **Come by OSA – we would be happy to talk through your list with you!**

Should you Send a Letter of Intent (LOI)? While not required, some students send a note or LOI to their top program to let them know they plan to rank them first. Do not send an LOI if it was discouraged by the program. Only send an LOI if you are certain of your ranking. An LOI is not a guarantee but may help programs understand your intent when creating their rank list.

Supplemental Rank Order Lists

If your application includes PGY-1 programs, be sure you understand how to create a [supplemental rank order list](#). Supplemental lists are only used for **Advanced (“A”) programs**. For each Advanced program on your primary rank order list, you’ll rank the corresponding PGY-1 programs on a supplemental list.

Note: If you are ranking preliminary programs as a backup plan, include them on your primary rank order list. Please discuss this approach with an OSA Dean.
